TwentyTwo Horses come to Wakeley Road by Robin Fisher

Fishers horseback orienteering ride was held last Saturday, August 19th on Wakely Road in Owen township. Groups of riders combed the Sassas Road/ Rice River area looking for those hidden stations. The ride was called Rockytop because it contained two high scenic overlooks for the horses to climb. Ride managers John, Robin, and Ann Fisher were squirming on Friday night when the rain was pouring down. Their Wooden Table Ride in Britt last fall got deluged with rain. But Saturday cleared off into a beautiful sunny day. Dave and Shirley Woods provided a wonderful deer shack for food and registration. The "haystacks" were well-received a mexican buffet where you start with corn chips and pile on items of your choice - burger, canned venison, chili beans, cheese, tomatoes, shredded zucchini, salsa and sour cream. It should have been named the "Zucchini" ride as all the winners recieved those green squashes. The ride was only six miles in length but made up for it in the challenges of finding your way through a maze of hayfields and "jungle" trails. Much thanks to the private landowners who allowed the horses to explore the area - Woods, O'Donnells, and Andersons. The first place winners came in in 1 hour, 27 minutes - Lori Hipple (Aurora) and Teri Radtke (Embarrass). Second place went to a mom and two daughters from Aurora , Sue, Kelsey, and Dana Ahonen at 2 hours, 6 minutes . Third place was Brooke Rolfson and Stephanie Rabbers (Embarrass) at 2 hours 9 minutes. Fourth place was a large team containing Beth Rolfson (Embarrass), Jacque Nelson (Tower), Deb Nelson (Embarrass) and Jack Ronning (Cook). They found all five stations in 2 hours 11 minutes. Fifth place went to three ladies from Ely - JoAnn Schreffler, Ruthanne Fenske, and Anne Portiner at 2 hours 36 minutes. Sixth place was Liz Frederick and Irene Danz (Duluth-Superior) at 2 hours and 46 minutes. Seventh place had a fast time of 1 hour and 38 minutes but only found four of the stations. This was another large group of four horses with Vicky Keopke (Gilbert), Nona and Mollianne Landecky (Hibbing) and Annette Griffith (Superior). Lori Hipple won a calculator for figuring out the anagram made by the station letters . The word was LIPPIZANER - a famous austrian breed of horses.
